Please join us for the Targeted, Individualized, and Intensive Positive Supports for Children and Adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Project ECHO® 6-session pilot series. This series is to support community providers, social workers, and related stakeholders who support children and adults with IDD who have complex or higher level behavioral needs and are supported through targeted, individualized, and intensive Positive Supports.

ECHO sessions include a brief didactic presentation, discussion, and case based learning between attendees and a hub team of interdisciplinary members from the University of Minnesota and the Department of Human Services representing Psychology, Psychiatry, Special Education, Care Coordination, Person Centered Practices, Positive Behavioral Supports, and Trauma-Informed Supports.

Project ECHO® is an "All Teach, All Learn" model in which there is a balance of learning from the interdisciplinary hub team and learning from joining attendees. **All attendees are encouraged to come ready to participate** and to share de-identified cases for case based learning discussions involving supporting children and adults with IDD who have complex or higher level behavioral needs. Attendees who bring cases for review will have the opportunity for additional consultation from hub team members, if desired.
