Planning

- 1. Determine the outcomes you want from using the identified strategy
- Determine the prompting questions, supports, and materials you need to ask to get to the desired outcome
- 2. Identify barriers and brainstorm solutions to plan for all students
- 3. Use solutions from above to plan
- 4. Determine supports to prepare (e.g., Will I need visual supports? What peer training is required?)
- 5. Determine what data will need to be collected to confirm student understanding

In Action

- 6. Deliver instruction
- 7. Collect data to determine student understanding
- 8. Be responsive to student performance for necessary adaptations

Evaluation

- 9. Review student success using data collected
- What worked and for whom?
- What adaptations will need to be made to ensure student success in the future?

What are Possible Barriers?	What are Possible Solutions?
Is there a barrier to student interest or engagement? Yes or No Ex: Student sits in the front facing the teacher instead of with a peer partner.	 → Ex: Teacher will pair students together for collaboration, if needed. → →
Is there a barrier to student background knowledge or receiving new information?	→ Ex: The special education teacher will include pictural options for new vocabulary, if needed.

Ex: New vocabulary presented without any context.	\rightarrow
Is there a barrier to how the student shows what they know?	→ Ex: The special education teacher will make choice cards with different response options, if needed.
