Enrollment for Students

- With a documented IDD
- Who completed K-12 education (may include 18-21 Transition)
- Who do not meet traditional college admission requirements
- Have the desire to go to college
- Able to participate in class and campus activities with support
- Who desire to earn a postsecondary credential
- With goals to live and work as independently as possible after college



Postsecondary Credential

- 2-4 years in length
- Classes audited and/or for credit
- In the student's primary area of study
- Includes work experience
- Earned from the college or university



Residential Living Options (colleges vary in what they offer)

- On-campus housing
- Off-campus University-owned housing
- Off-campus housing
- No housing offered

Federal and State Financial Aid Eligibility

Students with ID who attend an Institution of Higher Education with the US Department of Education Comprehensive Transition Postsecondary Program (CTP) designation may apply for Federal Financial Aid through the FAFSA. Minnesotans with IDD who attend a Minnesota institution of higher education with the CTP designation are considered for Minnesota grants and scholarships.
